**Sub : Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (TUFS).**

**1. Decisions taken by Inter Ministerial Steering Committee (IMSC) in its 21<sup>st</sup> meeting held at New Delhi on 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2006.**

- (i) **Inclusion of oil heated PLC controlled calendering machine for 10% capital subsidy in addition to 5% interest reimbursement under TUFS for processing sector.**

Oil heated PLC controlled 3 bowl calendering machine has been covered under the list of processing machines eligible for 10% capital subsidy in addition to 5% interest reimbursement under TUFS for processing sector. Accordingly, entry at sr. no. 40 in Annex-J of G.R. on TUFS is amended as under:

Annex-J – 40 Calendering Machine (7 bowls) / Oil heated PLC controlled 3 bowl calendering machine.

**2. Co-option of additional bank by IDBI.**

Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI), the nodal agency for Non-SSI sector of the textile industry has co-opted the Abhyudaya Co-operative Bank Ltd., Lord Krishna Bank Ltd., The Dhanalakshmi Bank Ltd., Centurion Bank of Punjab Ltd. and The Surat District Co-op. Bank Ltd.

**3. Decisions taken by Technical Advisory – Cum – Monitoring Committee (TAMC) in its 28<sup>th</sup> meeting held at Mumbai on 9<sup>th</sup> May, 2006.**

**A clarification was sought that if a mill eligible for TUFS installs captive power generation unit under a 100% subsidiary of the mill and the entire power generated by the 100% subsidiary is used by the principle mill, will the captive power generation plant be eligible for TUFS assistance.**

The 100% subsidiary setup by a TUFS compatible unit with same directors and with 100% captive consumption will be eligible for TUFS subsidy.

**The above modifications / clarifications in the TUF scheme may please be brought to the notice of all concerned.**
